## 1 Tower Bridge - London

Designed by Horace Jones and John Wolfe Barry the Tower Bridge is located on the river Thames near the Tower of London. A combined bascule and suspension bridge, construction began in 1886 and completed in 1894. In 1910, due to lack of use, the high level walkways were closed but were later reopened in 1982 as part of the new Tower Bridge Exhibition.

## 2 Salisbury Cathedral

Consecrated in 1258, the Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary, simply known as Salisbury Cathedral, is home to Britain's largest spire at 404ft. The cathedral houses one of four remaining Magna Cartas and also contains Europe's oldest working clock which was built in 1386. The clock has ticked more than 5 million times since its creation.

### 3 Buckingham Palace

Originally built by the Duke of Buckingham, John Sheffield in 1705, the building was known as Buckingham house. The building was later transformed into Buckingham Palace in the 1820's by architect John Nash for King George IV. Buckingham Palace has 775 rooms, a 40 acre garden, and is the Queen's official London residence.

## 1 Roussanou Monastery - Meteora

Located in Thessaly in an area called Meteora, meaning "suspended in air," stands Roussanou Monastery. It is one of six monasteries in the area built upon the natural rock pillars. Dedicated to St. Barbara, Roussanou was founded in 1545 by Maximos and Joasaph of Loannina. Today the monastery is occupied by a small community of nuns and is only reachable via a small bridge from an adjacent pillar.

#### 2 Oia Santorini

The small village of Oia is built along the cliffs on the north side of Santorini Island. It is characteristic of a traditional Greek village with its narrow streets and blue domed churches but is famous worldwide for its beautiful sunsets. The village is also home to a 19th century Naval Maritime Museum.

#### 3 Parthenon

Dedicated to the Greek goddess Athena, the Parthenon is a Doric Temple built on the Acropolis overlooking the city of Athens. Constructed mainly of marble from Mount Penteli, the construction of the Parthenon began in 447BC and was completed in 438BC. It is one of the last remaining symbols of ancient Greek civilization, and is currently undergoing a reconstruction and restoration effort.

## 1 Nan Lian Garden & Chi Lin Nunnery

Recently opened in 2006, Nan Lian Garden is a Tang Dynasty (618-906AD) styled park that covers 8 acres and features a golden pavilion amidst orange bridges spanning lotus and blue ponds. The garden sits adjacent to the Chi Lin Nunnery which was founded in the 1930's and renovated in 1990 in the Tang Dynasty style. This style of architecture uses no nails for the constructing of the buildings.

#### 2 The Great Wall

Major construction began on the wall under the Qin Dynasty in 221BC to protect the northern borders of the Chinese Empire from nomadic tribes. Much of the existing wall that can be seen today was built at a later time during the Ming Dynasty. The Great Wall and its branches extend for 5,500 miles across the northern part of China.

## 3 Hong Kong

Hong Kong is a special administrative region of the People's Republic of China, since China assumed sovereignty from British rule in 1997. Hong Kong is governed under the principle of "One Country, Two Systems," and is one of China's largest, most prosperous cities. It also has the highest population density in the world with roughly 6,300 people per square kilometer.



## 1 Iguazu Falls

Iguazu Falls is a series of waterfalls on the Iguazu River located along the border of Brazil and Argentina. The waterfall system consists of 275 falls along 1.7 miles of river. The largest fall being a 269ft tall, 490ft wide, and 2300ft long "Garganta del Diablo" or Devil's Throat. Gazing upon the falls Eleanor Roosevelt exclaimed "Poor Niagara."

#### 2 Christ the Redeemer

Standing 130ft tall, 98ft wide, and weighing 635 tons, Christ the Redeemer is one of the largest Art Deco sculptures ever created. It sits atop the 2,300ft Corcovado Mountain in the Tijuca Forest National Park where it overlooks the city of Rio de Janeiro. Sculpted out of soapstone and concrete by the Frenchman Paul Landowski, the statue took 5 years to construct and was completed in 1931 at a cost of \$250,000.

### Copacabana Beach

Located in the southern district of Rio de Janeiro, Copacabana beach stretches for 4km and is one of the most famous beaches in the world. It is named after the Copacabana Palace Hotel which opened in 1920. The beach also hosts one of the largest and most extravagant New Years Eve parties and fireworks displays in the world.

### 1 Mont Saint Michel

This rocky tidal island in Normandy is best known for its well preserved Benedictine Abbey of St. Michael. Italian architect William de Volpiano designed the church of the abbey in the 11th century, placing the transept crossing at the top of the mount, which at the time was a daring feat. In 1979, Mont Saint Michel was inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site for its architectural, cultural, and historical significance.

#### 2 Eiffel Tower

Built as an entrance arch for the Exposition Universelle, the 1889 world's fair marking the centennial of the French Revolution, the tower is named after its designer Gustave Eiffel. Nicknamed "La Dame de Fer" (The Iron Lady), the Eiffel Tower is the tallest structure in Paris at 324 meters, and since its construction in 1889 more than 200 million people have visited the tower.

#### Chateau de Chenonceau

Located near the village of Chenonceaux, the chateau was built on the river Cher in 1513 by Katherine Briconnet and her husband Thomas Bohier. Later, one of the most notable features, stone arches spanning the river, was built by Diane de Poitiers (mistress of Henri II). The chateau is renowned for its great collections of art, renaissance furniture, and XVI & XVII century tapestries.

## 1 The Twelve Apostles

The Twelve Apostles are a collection of 8 giant limestone rock stacks that rise up to 45 meters from the Southern Ocean. Located just east of Port Campbell along the Great Ocean Road, the formation is the main feature of Port Campbell National Park and is the result of 10-20 millions years of erosion.

#### 2 Great Barrier Reef

One of the seven wonders of the natural world, the Great Barrier Reef is the world's largest coral reef. The reef is composed of over 3000 individual reef systems, and is home to more than 400 coral species and over 1500 species of tropical fish. Located in the Coral Sea off the coast of Queensland, the Great Barrier Reef stretches for 1800 miles and is visible from outer space.

## 3 Sydney Opera House

The Sydney Opera House is a multi-venue performing arts center in Sydney, Australia's oldest and largest city. The Opera House was designed by Danish architect Jorn Utzon and was opened in 1973 by Queen Elizabeth II. On the buildings 30th birthday Utzon received architecture's highest honor, the Pritzker Prize.

## **1** Taj Mahal

The Taj Mahal, located in Agra, is a mausoleum constructed entirely of white marble. It was built by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan in memory of his third wife, Mumtaz Mahal. The Taj Mahal is considered to be the finest example of Mughal architecture, combining Persian, Islamic, and Indian styles. It is considered by many to be one of the most beautiful buildings in the world.

## 2 Bengal Tiger

The Bengal tiger is India's national emblem and has been since 2500BC. India holds roughly 2/3 of the Bengal tiger population. The average size of the Bengal tiger is 400-500lbs, and its average life span in the wild is roughly 15 years. It is said you can hear a Bengal tiger's roar up to 2 miles away.

### 3 Himalayas

The planet's highest mountain system, the Himalayas separate the Indian subcontinent from the Tibetan plateau. The system is home to the largest mountains in the world, Mt. Everest and K2. Developed 30-50 million years ago when the Indian plate collided with the Eurasian continental plate; earthquakes and tremors are still prevalent in the region today as the plates continue to collide.



### The Cathedral of Santa Maria del Fiore

Also known as the Florence Duomo, Santa Maria del Fiore translates to Saint Mary of the Flower, and is the third largest cathedral in the world. Designed by Arnolfo di Cambio, construction began on the duomo in 1296. With the completion of the dome, designed by Filippo Brunelleschi, the cathedral was finally consecrated by Pope Eugene IV in 1436.

## Vineyard - Chianti Region, Tuscany

The Chianti region of Tuscany is situated between the towns of Siena and Florence. Known throughout the world for its exceptional food and rich culture; the Chianti region is also one of the most beautiful areas of Tuscany. ## **3** Venice - "The Floating City"

Venice is the capital of the Veneto region in northern Italy. The city stretches across 117 small islands along the Adriatic Sea. It is most famous for its series of canals which are used as a primary form of transportation throughout the city. ## 1 Hozomon Gate at Senso-ji Temple

Hozomon Gate is the gateway to Senso-ji Temple, Tokyo's oldest temple located in the Asakusa district. According to a chronicle from the XV century the gate was originally built in 942 by military commander Taira no Kinmasa. The gate houses many of Senso-ji Temple's treasures and is known for its massive red paper lantern.

### **2** Kinkaku-ji - "Golden Temple"

Known as the Temple of the Golden Pavilion or Golden Temple, Kinkaku-ji is a Zen Buddhist temple in Kyoto. Originally a retirement villa for Shogun Ashikaga Yoshimitsu it was converted to a Zen temple in 1408 following his death. The top two stories of the temple are covered with pure gold leaf which makes it one of the most popular buildings in Japan to visit.

### 3 Japanese Macaque - "Snow Monkey"

Pictured is a pair of Japanese Macaque sitting in a hot spring at Jigokudani Monkey Park in Yamanouchi near Nagano. Known as "Hell's Valley" due its hot springs, Jigokudani is part of Joshinetsu Kogen National Park. During the winter months the snow monkeys travel down to Jigokudani to sit and relax in the warm waters of the hot springs.

### 1 Neuschwanstein Castle

Built as homage to composer Richard Wagner for the shy King Ludwig II. Construction started on the castle in 1868, and was still unfinished at the time of Ludwig's death in 1886. Only 14 rooms were finished at the time of his death but the castle was then opened to the public. Known to be the inspiration for Disney's Sleeping Beauty Castle, Neuschwanstein receives an estimated 1.3 million visitors every year.

## 2 Munich City Center

Pictured is the Theatinerkirche (Theatine Church) in Munich's "Old City." This church was built in an Italian Baroque style and features a yellow Rococo facade that makes the building stand out compared to the surrounding architecture. Munich is the capital city of Bavaria and also hosts the annual Oktoberfest celebration. In 2010, Oktoberfest drew 6.4 million visitors who drank more than 5 million liters of beer.

## **3** Brandenburger Tor

Commissioned by King Frederick William II of Prussia as a sign of peace, the Brandenburger Tor (Brandenburg Gate) was constructed from 1788-1791 by Carl Gotthard Langhans. The capital Quadriga (chariot) was sculpted by Johann Gottfried Schadow. The gate has represented many different things for the german people throughout history, but today it is seen as a sign of unity.

## 1 The Kremlin

The Kremlin is a citadel built on 90 acres in the heart of Moscow. The construction of the Kremlin can be divided into three periods: the wooden Kremlin (XIII century), the Italian Renaissance Kremlin, and the modern Kremlin constructed by Catherine the Great (XVIII century). The Kremlin houses the world's largest bell, the Tsar Bell, which stands 20 feet tall and weighs 200 tons.

#### 2 St. Basil's Cathedral

Known as the Cathedral of Intercession of the Virgin on the Moat, St. Basil's Cathedral was constructed in Red Square between 1555-1561. It was commissioned by Ivan IV (Ivan the Terrible) to commemorate the capture of Kazan and Astrakhan. Outside the cathedral stands a bronze statue to Minin & Pozharsky, leaders of the militia that repelled the Polish invasion of 1612.

#### Grand Cascade at Petrodvorets

The palace (Petrodvorets) and fountain complex in St. Petersburg is often referred to as the "Russian Versailles." The complex was founded in 1714 by Peter the Great and later the Grand Cascade was added by Empress Elizabeth, Peter's granddaughter, to commemorate the victory over Sweden in the Great Northern War. The main fountain depicts "Samson tearing apart the jaws of the lion."

## 1 Tulum - Mayan Ruins

Known as "the walled city," and located on the east coast of the Yucatan Peninsula, Tulum was built on the bluffs overlooking the Caribbean Sea. During the decline of the Mayan civilization the city flourished as a trading port around 1200AD. The city was inhabited up until the Spanish conquest and today the city is a properly tourist destination as it is just 80 miles from Cancun.

#### **Z** Cancun

Offering pristine beaches, exciting night life, first class hotels and restaurants, and a large Mayan culture; Cancun is known as one of the premier vacation destinations in the world. The Cancun National Marine Park features a large underwater museum that was started in 2009. Divers and snorkelers will delight in the museum which will feature more than 400 statues by artist Jason de Caires Taylor.

#### The Palace of Fine Arts

The Palace of Fine Arts began its construction in 1904 with an Art Nouveau design from Italian architect Adamo Boari. The construction was delayed by the Mexican Revolution of 1910 and it wasn't until many years later that President Pascual Ortíz Rubio decided to start the project again. Enlisting Mexican architect Federico Mariscal, the building was completed in 1934 with an Art Deco interior.


